# LN and LC Distinguished Alumni 2022

To commemorate Homecoming, we recognize outstanding alumni who have displayed extraordinary gifts of leadership, achieved recognition for their professional expertise, attained success in their field of endeavor, and provided service to their community and/or LT Schools. A committee representing the MSD of Lawrence Township and the Lawrence Township School Foundation reviewed the nominations and submitted to the superintendent recommendations for selection. Those selected were then confirmed by the Board of Education.

Congratulations to this year's Distinguished Alumni: **Chris Hill**, LN 2001, **Ashley Spencer**, LN 2011, and **James Duke**, LC 1986!

Chris Hill was an outstanding two-sport student-athlete. Coaches referenced Chris when describing how actions in the classroom transfer to greatness on the field/court. He was a three-year starter at quarterback, finishing as the all-time leader in passing yards and touchdowns. In basketball, he led the Wildcats to a sectional and regional championship during his senior year and was named an Indiana All-Star.

Chris continued with basketball at Michigan State and took the Spartans to the NCAA Final Four. He was named the 2005 Academic All-American of the Year by ESPN. After graduating from MSU, he played 10 years of professional basketball in Europe, not only winning three championships, but also meeting his wife! Since retiring from basketball, Chris has worked in the mortgage industry where he has achieved great success.

Ashley Spencer is an elite track and field athlete who won a bronze medal in the 400m sprint in the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro. Her running career began at LN where she led the Wildcats to IHSAA track & field championships in 2009 and 2011. During her high school career, she won 12 IHSAA individual and relay state titles. She won two NCAA championships in the 400m for the University of Illinois and ran for the University of Texas.

Ashely has been on the national/international racing circuit for the last decade. In addition to her Olympic bronze medal from 2016, at the 2013 World Championships, she was a silver medalist on the 4 x 400m relay. She won a silver medal in the 400m and a gold

medal in the 4 x 400m relay at the 2016 World Indoors. She won gold at the 2017 World Relays in the 4 x 400m relay. In 2019, she made the USA World Team in the 400m hurdles, where she finished 6th at the IAAF World Championships. She was a finalist in the 400m hurdles at the 2020 US Olympic Trails and the 2022 US Nationals. Ashley plans to compete for a spot on the 2024 U.S. team for the Olympics in Paris. In the meantime, she is a professional runner for Nike.

At LC, **James Duke** took on a variety of leadership roles for various organizations as well as participating in competitions with Lawrence Central's show choir, Central Sound. After graduating from Morehouse College with a degree in business analytics and marketing, he returned to Indiana and started working with the Family Social Services, where he developed a passion for working with youth and promoting diversity. He is committed to providing our young folks and entrepreneurs with the tools to help them navigate to be successful so they can have sustainable futures for years to come.







## LC Athletic Hall of Fame Class of 2022

It was our pleasure to host the 3 inductees into the LC Athletic Hall of Fame at the LC vs. Pike High School football game on September 16. Before being recognized and presented with their awards at halftime, **Randy Reeser**, **Ken Carpenter**, and **Chris Read**, all from the Class of 1971, enjoyed Bear hospitality and participated in the ceremonial coin toss before kick-off.

Halfback, **Randy Reeser**, was an All-State running back for 1970-1971. He rushed for 1,087 yards, averaged 7.9 yards per carry, and was named Indianapolis All-City and County in 1969 and 1970.

1970-1971 All-State Quarterback, **Ken Carpenter**, led Marion County in touchdown passes with 14 passes and 1,085 passing yards. He was also the punter for the Bears, averaging 35 yards per kick. He was named Indianapolis All-City, All-County and All-State in 1970. Ken and Randy provided a strong one-two punch for the Bears during the 1970 season.

The 1970 440m State Champion, **Chris Read**, received 1st place in City/County, 1st place in Sectional, Regional, and State. He lost only one race all year in 1970. At the time he was only 1/10th of a second off the all-time city/county record.

"These 3 outstanding student-athletes represented LC with determination, integrity, and respect. We are pleased to honor them with this award," shared Mosi Barnes, LC Athletic Director.

## Music for All: Marching Pride of Lawrence Township



What's your favorite high school memory? Chances are it's not an assignment or a big test! Memories come from the people you spend time with; doing the things that made you laugh, cry, and grow as a person. For many, it's Friday Night Lights, whether you are cheering in the stands, scoring touchdowns, or playing in the marching band.

The **Marching Pride of Lawrence Township (MPLT)** comprised of LC and LN musicians and performers learn and rehearse countless hours together to create an 8-minute musical journey to entertain and compete at local and national competitions. All are welcome to participate, regardless of skill level. Following the cancellation of the 2020 season, there were fewer than 140 marchers. This year there are 175 members. In their opening local competition at

Northwestern High School (Kokomo), the Marching Pride captured first place in Class A. Their next national competition takes the band to Louisville to compete in the Bands of America Regional Competition. Head Director, DiaShamar Marshall, is focused on growing the program and is preparing for when MPLT is 250 strong.





MPLT directors are committed to students who show interest and a willingness to work hard. They do not want students to be left out because of ability to pay the annual participation fees.

In order to meet the student participation scholarship requests, MPLT is engaging in an effort to raise \$1,000 from 100 local organizations. "The \$100,000 raised in this campaign will address the financial barrier to participation for our students and their families," explained Erin Leraris, volunteer for MPLT Strategic Partnerships.


