Wow! The combined class of over 1100 grads was highly recognized with awards and scholarships. There were a total of 153 Distinguished Scholars, with Valedictorians Jain Iftesam (LN) and Yahya Amjad (LC) leading the classes, assisted by Salutatorians Kaitlin Fasbender (LN), Olivia Weisiger (LN) and Nehemiah Boyd (LC). This class earned over \$45M in scholarships, as well as numerous other prestigious international, national, and state awards and designations.

The Lawrence Township School Foundation awarded 43 scholarships with a total value of \$77,500. The LTSF Scholarship Committee reviewed the largest pool of applicants we've ever seen with 232 applications. Committee member Janet Jacobs noted, "Serving on this committee was an honor. I read the aspirations and dreams of these kids and there was one takeaway. Our diverse student body is extremely motivated. They get excellent grades all while spending hours on extracurricular activities and community service. It made me feel so proud to be a part of awarding scholarships that would help them achieve their goals."



John Kendrick, the Powers & Sons Scholarship recipient, attended the Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Tour funded by LTSF his sophomore year. During the tour, he set his sights on attending Howard University. John applied and was accepted! With the support of the \$20,000 Powers & Sons Scholarship, John will attend Howard University, to study pre-law in preparation to become a social justice lawyer.

Doctors at Riley Hospital for Children used a new technology called Small Intestinal Submucosa (SIS) that uses pig intestines for soft tissue repairs. Logan was one of the first infants to receive the treatment, leading to normal growth and development. This spring, Logan, a Purdue graduating senior, attended an awards ceremony where he met Purdue alumnus Dr. Umesh Patel, who was recognized for the SIS technology he helped to develop years ago.
